

#YouAreNotAlone	 The Perinatal Institute is supporting Baby Loss Awareness Week 9-15 October 2020 We are continuing our efforts to improve safety and quality in maternity care. While there are still too many preventable deaths, there has also been good progress. We present an update on national stillbirth rates and the Growth Assessment Protocol (GAP), which is running in near 80% of all NHS Trusts and Health Boards in the UK.
	 Stillbirth rates in England continuing to fall Latest ONS data (to 2019) show a decline in stillbirth rates to 3.83/1000 This represents a 28.4% reduction compared to the previous 10 year average, and the prevention of over 1000 stillbirths each year
4.37 4.27 3.99 -P+0.04	 Reduction in stillbirths linked to GAP uptake doi.org/10.1002/uog.22187 There was an overall decline, associated with better protocols & awareness NHS Trusts that followed GAP guidance achieved significant further reduction Steepest drop observed in units with best SGA detection rates However study also highlighted that there is much more room for improvement
	 Sustained reduction in stillbirths also seen in Scotland <u>doi.org/10.1002/uog.22100</u> <u>Latest NRS data (to 2019)</u> show continued drop to lowest ever levels Report included data from the 12 (of 14) Scottish Health Boards in the GAP program At least one Scottish Health Board amongst best performing units in the UK
	 COVID-19 and fetal growth surveillance We are monitoring national GAP data during the pandemic, and salute the many frontline professionals providing best possible care under challenging circumstances. To date, there appears to have been no significant effect on overall stillbirth rates There was a slight drop in SGA detection from April but this is starting to recover The best performing GAP units continue to record SGA detection rates of over 60%
Power Bl	 Automated GAP reports Our current reports are being enhanced by a 'Power BI' reporting system The new functionality, accessible within GROW, to be launched November 2020 It will provide unit level information for each NHS Trust and Health Board, with GAP metrics including also information required for NHS England SBL-CBv2 reports
